

SAINSBURY'S (OR MAINSBURY'S)

42-45 SIDNEY STREET, CB2 3HX

No other supermarket in Cambridge enjoys the same amount of clout and fame that the Sainsbury's on Sidney Street does. Located directly on the doorstep of Sidney Sussex College, *Mainsbury's* (as it is affectionately referred to) is one of the only fully stocked supermarkets close to the city centre.

It is not the most affordable supermarket, but you will get your money's worth, as the products are of high quality; the supermarket has a range of products of varying prices, from their more affordable Sainsbury's house brands to more upmarket, fancy groceries and household items. It also has a small selection of Asian foodstuffs, a bakery, and a decent alcohol section.

Mainsbury's recently reduced their opening hours to 7:30a.m.-11p.m. on all days except Sunday, where the opening hours are much shorter from 11a.m.-5p.m. (you'll find this is a common trend among many supermarkets).

Pro tip: check out their bread and bakes section for specially priced products - these are generally baked goods that will expire soon, but are good to eat if you don't keep them too long. Also, get a Nectar card to collect points that can offset your future purchases.

Aldi is one of the cheaper places to buy groceries. Fresh food, essentials, frozen food, and alcohol are all affordable. Chances are you can also get an Aldibrand knockoff of your favourite namebrand stuff.

Variety-wise, it has all the basics you'll require, as well as a random selection of household items and knick-knacks. However, the food can sometimes go bad or moldy before their expiry date, so choose your vegetables carefully!

There are two Aldis - one on Histon Road (near the Hill Colleges) and another at the Cambridge Retail Park.

Iceland is located directly next door to the Aldi on Histon Road. It sells a huge range of frozen foods and snacks, from pork crackling to frozen Gregg's sausage rolls, to whole turkeys.

Price-wise, it is not the most affordable, and some items are comparable in price to Sainsbury's. However, their variety of frozen foods (including ice cream) makes up for it (they even sell frozen prata). If you're at a Hill College, you'll probably pop in when you go to Aldi.

The TESCO Superstore is the king of variety. Not only do you have all kinds of food products and groceries, you have a sizeable selection of household items, cleaning products, and toiletries as well.

It's slightly more affordable than Sainsbury's, and the quality is decent. The variety is great, with good vegan and vegetarian options, and a sizeable Asian section as well.

The TESCO Superstore is near the Cambridge Retail Park and thus a distance away from most colleges, so it is mostly recommended for purchases at the beginning of the week.

Pro Tip: apply for a free TESCO Clubcard to enjoy special discounts at all TESCO stores; you can also collect points that can be traded in for youchers.

Think of ASDA as an Aldi on steroids; it is a massive superstore with relatively affordable prices. Some stuff is cheaper than Aldi (especially their promotional items, such as 3 meat items for £10), but depending on what you buy, a shop here may not be worth the distance, and may even be more expensive than your shop elsewhere (especially Aldi).

With that being said, the selection and variety of items available is great. Their Asian section is good, and there is Milo (not Singaporean-made if you're that particular).

As mentioned, it is not the most accessible, and cycling back with a full basket of groceries may be difficult

Pro tip: if you want cheap crockery and home stuff, try ASDA! They have some nice home items, and their house brand cleaning products is quite cheap as well. Make the trip less painful on your legs by sharing an Uber here with your college mates.

places to eat

The food in Cambridge may not completely satisfy the Singaporean palette, but there are still great places to eat!

Of course, no prices can match that of our hawkers, so do visit these eating places expecting to spend more than you would in Singapore.

You will notice that eateries here tend to offer more vegan and vegetarian options. However, it might be harder to find Halal-certified restaurants.

BIRD THAI NOODLE BAR (THAI FOOD TRUCK)

LOCATION: MARKET SQUARE PRICE POINT: £55

FOOD: Basically, everything they serve in the menu is pretty good. Apart from what you see above, they also serve drinks like Thai iced tea, iced green tea, and iced lemon tea.

ALSO: This stall is very popular among Singaporeans and Malaysians! If you come here for lunch on the weekends, you'll almost definitely run into them.



JUST GREEK GYROS

LOCATION: MARKET SQUARE PRICE RANGE: \$55

FOOD: this stall sells Greek gyros. Choose between fillings of chicken, pork, chicken and pork, or vegetables and halloumi. All gyros come with fries and are wrapped in pita bread. When served, the meat is freshly shaved off the rotisserie. The food is very filling, and the serving of meat is very generous.

ALSO: Be prepared to pay in cash! Sometimes, the store's card reader does not work. Thankfully, if you do not have cash because you are expecting to pay by card, but then find out that the card reader is not working, the proprietor will kindly allow you to take your food first and come back with cash later on. If you need cash at Market Square, there's an ATM just outside M&S.





WILDWOOD

LOCATION: NEAR ST JOHN'S COLLEGE PRICE RANGE: ££5

FOOD: This stall sells dishes like carbonara, pizza, steak, and ribs. Personally, I always order the steak when I dine in, and have the pizza when I call for delivery. Once again, the portions are generally substantial.

ALSO: They tend to have discounts for students. Over the winter, this was 50%, and in early spring, this was 40%. Do check again when you arrive in Cambridge, the terms of the discount might be different by then.



GOLDEN HOUSE

LOCATION: REGENT STREET, NEAR HUGHES

HALL

PRICE RANGE: £55

FOOD: They serve Thai, Malay, and Chinese cuisine. There are too many dishes here for me to name, but I'll name one. I like the "Sauteed Pork Belly Slices in Hot Sauce"(回锅肉)the most because they do not skimp on the meat.

ALSO: This is another popular choice among Singaporeans. I have only had food delivered from here, but word has it that before the pandemic, dining-in always means a squeeze because of the restaurant's small dining area, and there are often many diners. Contact them via WeChat (goldenhousecambridge) for deliveries!



YIM WAH

LOCATION: REGENT STREET, NEAR HUGHES HALL PRICE RANGE: \$\$\$

FOOD: Their main dishes are Cantonese dishes such as Har Gao, Siew Yuk. Char Siu. and





Roast Duck. Whenever I go to Yim Wah, I make it a point to order their roasted meats, in particular the Siew Yuk which is my personal favourite. The Siew Yuk is fatty, the skin is crispy, and the meat is tender. Sometimes, I would go to Yim Wah and order nothing but a £10 serving of just Siew Yok because I like it that much. Yim Wah is very authentic, and if you are a carnivore, you must give it a try.

JACK'S GELATO

LOCATION: ALL SAINTS PASSAGE OR NEAR MARKET SQUARE/CORPUS CHRISTI

PRICE RANGE: £££

FOOD: Jack's serves gelato, coffee, and hot chocolate. I really like the ice cream here because of the variety of flavours, the creaminess of the ice cream, and the quality of ingredients.



My three favourite scoops are mint stracciatella, honeycomb (with crunchy bits of honeycomb), and vanilla chopped brownie (with chunky bits of brownie mixed in). I love Jack's Gelato so much that I have at times come back more than once in a single day, ordering a total of four scoops.

ALSO: If you are a member of societies such as MedSoc, you might be eligible for further discounts. The International Student Campaign (ISC) also occasionally gives out free scoops from Jack's Gelato, so check out their Facebook page too!

Follow @gelatojack for the menu! It changes every day, and sometimes, there are secret menu items only announced on their Instagram story.

WETHERSPOONS (OR SPOONS)

LOCATION: REGENT STREET, NEAR EMMANUEL COLLEGE & THE GRAND ARCADE
PRICE RANGE: \$\$\frac{1}{2}\$

FOOD: Affectionately known as "Spoons", this is Cambridge's biggest pub, with a wide selection of drinks. While the food may not be the best, the relative affordability and the good service makes up for it!



At night, many people gather there for drinks, but it is definitely a go-to place for many to study in the day for the free coffee refills and brunch.





AROMI

LOCATION: NEAR MARKET SQUARE OR NEAR GRAFTON PRICE RANGE: £££

FOOD: Delicious Sicilian-style pizza/sandwich and other Italian pastries. Aromi also serves gelato in the summer months and their Pistachio gelato is divine.

ALSO: Remember to request for your food to be heated up. The way the cheese and the fats from the meat (if you choose a meat option) melt together is just amazing.

halal food guide

GENERAL TIPS:

Some colleges offer halal food at hall, but some may not openly publicise it – email your catering department to ask.

Similarly, some restaurants use halal meat (usually chicken) but don't openly say it, feel free to ask again! Many waiters ask beforehand is anyone at the table has any allergies, this is a good chance to ask if the meat is halal.

Most restaurants usually have vegan/vegetarian options (useful if you have an organized event at any of them).

Some restaurants may advertise themselves as 'Halal' but serve pork – usually means at least their chicken is halal, but safest is to usually clarify again.

Groceries-wise, there are many fully halal grocers along Mill Road. Sainsbury's Sidney Street (aka Mainsbury's) and ASDA have fresh halal meat, while Tesco Superstore has frozen meat (kebabs/chicken breast/prata).

SHOPPING NECESSITIES:

BEDDING

You will need a duvet, a pillow, as well as sheets and duvet/pillow covers. Different colleges provide a different combination of these things, and some may have a set available for rent or sale.

However, if you would like to purchase your own, head over to Wilko, Primark, or ASDA to get them for an affordable price. If you have more expensive tastes, you can also consider buying them from John Lewis.

If you're looking to bring your own fitted sheets, remember that UK bed sizes are different to Singapore's!

OTHER APPLIANCES

Most household appliances can be found in larger supermarkets like **Sainsbury's** and the **Tesco Superstore**. Most people will also invest in a water filter as water in Cambridge is 'hard water' (which contains calcium carbonate), which can leave white deposits on anything you use. **TKMaxx** is another good place to find cooking appliances.

If you prefer online shopping, **Amazon** is always an option and will have everything you need! You get 6 months free Amazon prime for being a student, but you can register more than one address under a single account, so it is a good idea to share one with your friends to maximise savings!

TOILETRIES

You can find pretty much everything you'll need at **Boots** and **Superdrug**. Also check out **Poundland** (basically UK's version of Daiso) for good deals.

The climate in the UK tends to be quite dry, so it is good to invest in lip balm and moisturiser.

STATIONERY

Most stationery is expensive in the UK (and not of great quality); however, you can get writing pads (e.g. foolscap paper) and ring files from most stationery stores, such as W.H. Smith, or Ryman.

CLOTHES

If you have no clothes appropriate for fall/winter, you can pop over to Primark (really cheap fast fashion) to get sweatshirts and jackets. Alternatively, there are other (relatively pricier) shops such as H&M and Superdry.

Another more sustainable alternative is to check out the various charity shops around cambridge, such as Scope, British Heart Foundation, and the East Anglia Children's Hospice (EACH).

Charity shops are a great way to shop more sustainably, and some stores have really great items for a fraction of the price. It's worth having a look around because you'll be surprised at just what you can find!
